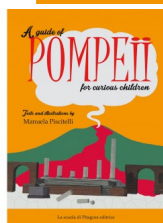
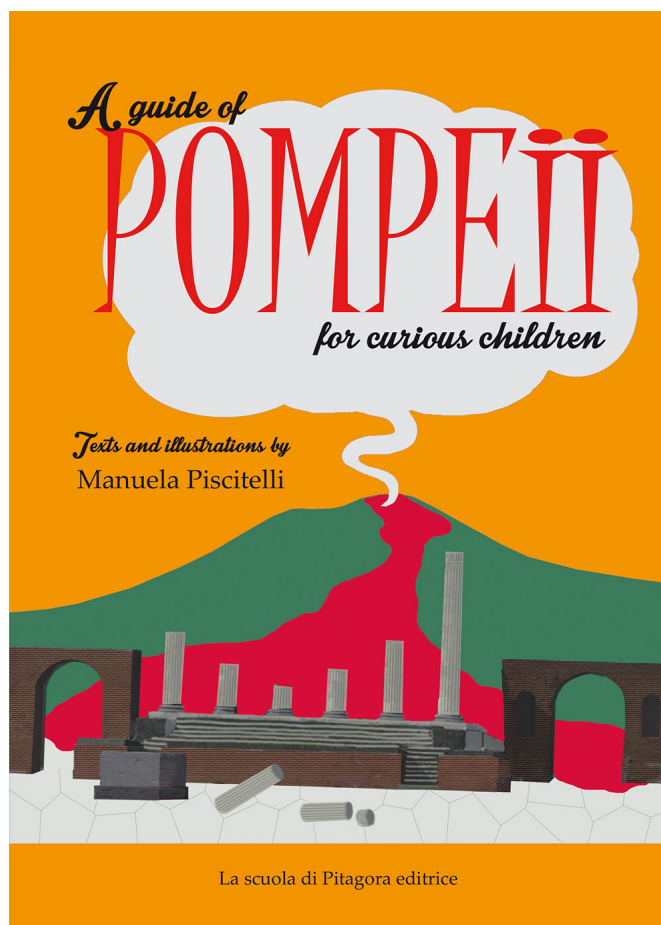


A guide of Pompeii for curious children
